# Academic Scholarships

## Academic Scholarship Deadline: FEBRUARY 1

For more information on the following four scholarships, contact the Department of Student Financial Aid at (573) 681-6156. In respect to all other scholarships printed in this booklet, please contact the respective department or division as indicated.

*All applicants are not guaranteed to receive the following scholarships due to limited funds available.*

### Curator's Scholarship:

- The applicant must have graduated from an accredited Missouri high school, **and**
- Ranked in the top 10% of his/her graduating class, **or**
- Achieved an ACT composite score of 24 or higher, **or**
- Earned a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or higher.  
*(student meeting all of the above criteria is given highest priority)*
- Recipient must matriculate at LU the first semester immediately following high school graduation.
- Covers approximately 90% of the cost of tuition, incidental, and student activity fees; on-campus housing; and \$450 that can be used towards book and educational supplies per semester. (Scholarship does not cover health insurance.)

### Presidential Scholarship:

- The applicant must have graduated from an accredited high school (Missouri and out-of-state applicants are welcome), **and**
- Ranked in the top 20% of his/her high school graduating class, **or**
- Achieved an ACT Composite score of 22 or higher, **or**
- Earned a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.  
*(student meeting all of the above is given highest priority)*
- Recipient must matriculate at LU the first semester immediately following high school graduation.
- Covers approximately 80% of the cost of tuition/incidental and student activity fees; and \$1,000 per semester towards on-campus housing costs; and \$400 per semester that can be used towards book and educational supplies. (Scholarship does not cover health insurance.)

### Institutional Scholarship:

- The applicant must have completed 30 or more hours of college work, **with**
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- Available to current LU students or students transferring to LU from other colleges/universities.
- Covers approximately 70% of the cost of tuition, incidental, and student activity fees (*partial institutional scholarships given on occasion for lesser amounts*); \$750 per semester toward on-campus housing costs; and \$350 per semester that can be used towards book and educational supplies. (Scholarship does not cover health insurance.)

*The above listed three scholarships are renewable up to 8 consecutive semesters if the student maintains a 3.0 cumulative GPA and satisfies the minimum academic requirement of a full-time student (12 credit hours a semester).*

### Dean's Scholarship: (Non-Renewable)

- Available to the student graduating from any accredited high school nationwide **and** who has completed at least 60 hours at Lincoln University.
- Student must have ranked in the top 30% of high school graduating class, **or**
- Achieved an ACT composite score of 20 or higher, **or**
- Earned a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher (both high school and college level)
- Covers approximately 50% of the cost of tuition, incidental, and student activity fees; \$500 per semester toward on-campus housing costs; and \$250 per semester that can be used towards book and educational supplies. (Scholarship does not cover health insurance.)

**\*\*The above scholarships will only be applied to charges of up to 15 credit hours.\*\***

**NAACP Scholarships:** Please contact the local NAACP organization for more information regarding the scholarships listed below and how to apply for them.

**Oscar O. Lawson Minority Pre-Med Scholarship:** Awarded to a minority student who aspires to become a physician and is in need of financial assistance.

**David Brent Minority Social Worker Scholarship:** Awarded to a minority student majoring in Sociology or Psychology, aspiring to become a Social Worker, and who demonstrates a need for financial assistance.

**Lorine F. Knight Minority Education Scholarship:** Awarded to a minority student majoring in Education, who wishes to become a teacher and who demonstrates a need for financial assistance.

**Charles E. "Lefty" Robinson Black Studies Scholarship:** Awarded to a minority student, seeking a degree in Liberal Arts Education with a minor in Black Studies, who demonstrates a need for financial assistance.

**Soldier's Scholarship:**

- The applicant must have graduated from an accredited high school (Missouri and out-of state applicants are welcome), **and**
- Ranked in the top 20% of his/her high school graduating class, **or**
- Achieved an ACT Composite score of 18 or higher, **or**
- Earned a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.  
*(student meeting all of the above is given highest priority)*
- Recipient must matriculate at LU the first semester immediately following high school graduation.
- Recipient will receive \$1000/year to be used towards tuition, fees, room, and board. Scholarship is renewable for up to 4 consecutive years as long as student maintains a 3.00 GPA.

**LU Founder's Scholarship:**

- The applicant must have graduated from an accredited high school (Missouri and out-of-state applicants are welcome), **and**
- Ranked in the top 20% of his/her high school graduating class, **or**
- Achieved an ACT Composite score of 17 or higher, **or**
- Earned a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.  
*(Student meeting all of the above is given highest priority)*
- Recipient must matriculate at LU the first semester immediately following high school graduation.
- Recipient will receive \$1500 for their first year to be used towards tuition, fees, room, and board. This award is not renewable.

## *Athletic Scholarships*

Awarding of an athletic financial aid agreement is under the direction of each Head Coach. For more information regarding types of athletic aid, please contact the Department of Athletics at (573) 681-5342.

NCAA rules prevent aid from being awarded for more than one year at a time. You will be notified by mail prior to July 1 of the status of your grant-in-aid for the following year. If aid is reduced or terminated, and you feel this reduction or cancellation is unfair or unjustified, you have the right to request a hearing, as provided by NCAA regulations. To make this request, contact the Director of Student Financial Aid at (573) 681-6156 by July 15 of the year in which you receive your cancellation or reduction letter, and an appeal hearing will be scheduled for you with the financial aid appeals committee.

### *Athletics Grant-In-Aid*

Students must be enrolled for a minimum of 12 hours to be eligible for financial aid.

Institutional financial aid may be reduced or canceled during the period of the award if the student-athlete:

1. Renders himself or herself ineligible for intercollegiate competition; or
2. Fraudulently misrepresents any information on an application, letter of intent or financial aid agreement; or
3. Engages in serious misconduct warranting substantial disciplinary penalty; or
4. Voluntarily withdraws from a sport for personal reasons.

A scholarship athlete who fails to follow training rules and/or who does not exhibit an effort to improve his/her skills may also be subject to cancellation or non-renewal of athletic aid the following year.

### *Expenses Not Covered By Athletic Scholarship*

The following is a list of items not covered by and athletic scholarship.

1. At the book store: non-required books, apparel, books bags, and gift items.
2. Parking fees and fines
3. Add-drop and late charges
4. Deposits (Room, Key)
5. Cost of treatment for out-of-season and non-athletic injuries
6. Library fines
7. Damage to University Property
8. Lost or stolen meal cards, books, or keys
9. Typing ( and other services) costs
10. Student Health Insurance
11. Telephone Bills
