

SUBJECT: Action Item – Flat Rate tuition

Based on historical trends, Lincoln University's average four-year graduation rate is 9% with the six-year graduation rate averaging 23%. The most recent cohort is 2013 with a four-year graduation rate of 8% and six-year graduation rate of 26%. To focus students on a four-year graduation path, students must register and be successful at 15 credit hours per semester. Implementation of a flat rate tuition will strongly encourage students to register for the 15 credit hours per semester.

The attached flat rate proposal would create a flat rate tuition for students taking 12 to 18 credit hours. Students taking 12-14 hours will see an increase in total cost if they continue to register for 12 credit hours. Students taking 15 credit hours will not be impacted as the flat rate tuition is based on the 15 per credit hour rate. Students taking greater than 15 credit hours will see a reduction in cost per semester.

A secondary impact of creating the flat rate tuition is the discount received by students taking greater than 15 credit hours. If a student previously took 18 hours, they paid \$218.25 per credit hour plus fees. Moving to a flat rate tuition, students taking 18 credit hours will be paying \$181.88 per credit hour plus fees, a savings of \$36.37 per credit hour. This discount will provide an additional recruitment tool.

Your approval of the flat rate tuition effective fall 2020 is requested.
