RE: CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT FOR RENOVATIONS

to DWIGHT T. REED STADIUM

This office is requesting approval of a construction contract for the renovations to Dwight T. Reed Stadium.

The scope of work for this project includes removal of existing natural turf field and installation of a new artificial turf field, removal and replacement of the scoreboard, sound system and LED field lights, relocation of the field jump events, restrooms renovations to bring into compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act — new partitions, plumbing fixtures, lighting, painting, electrical, resurfacing of the concourse track area, concrete cleaning, concourse lighting, painting of metal awnings, roof drain repairs, turnstyle removal, newly updated logo graphics, and new walking path to include stairs, concrete pathway, security lighting and emergency call phones from softball field parking lot (east side) to The Linc parking lot (west side). One add alternate was taken to upgrade the track to the Mondo track surfacing product, recommended by Coach Victor Thomas. Alternate #2 is for the reduced cost to have a gravel walking path in lieu of a concrete path.

Attached is a copy of the bid tabulation. Bids were received on May 11, 2017. Four companies submitted bids for the project.

Funding for this project will be from the student athletic fee and the loan/bond financing supported by the student athletic fee, maintenance and repair funds, and other funding.

The University has a goal of 10% Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) participation and 5% Women Business Enterprise (WBE) participation, which follows the State Executive Order 05-30.

As outlined on the attached spreadsheet, this project was advertised in several newspapers, sent to various plan rooms, as well as listed on the Lincoln University website. This office strongly

encourages and speaks specifically to the contractors at the pre-bid conference for each project about the MBE/WBE goals. Please see the spreadsheet.

The construction is slated to begin immediately and be completed by September 5, 2017.

Reference checks are underway.

Tuition, Fees and Room and Board Increases

Tuition and Fees – effective fall 2017

Attached please find the proposed tuition and fee increases. Based on the February 24, 2017 notice from Zora Mulligan, Commissioner of Higher Education and HESFA guidelines, Lincoln University can increase tuition and fees at the rate of 2.1% or \$144.64 for the academic year. Please recall that HESFA guidelines apply to instate undergraduate tuition and fee rates only. The allowable increase was applied as follows:

- Increase per credit hour rate from \$205 to \$209 per credit hour.
- Increase the Building and Maintenance fees from \$119.84 to \$132.16 per semester.

All other tuition rates increased at a rate comparable to the 2.1% with the exception of the dual credit tuition rate. The Dual credit tuition rate will remain at \$75 per credit hour to remain competitive in that market.

Other Fees – effective immediately

Increase in transcript fees from \$5 each to \$10 each. An analysis was completed of all other four-year public state institutions as well as a few local private institutions to determine that the most common transcript cost was \$10 per transcript. This increase makes Lincoln University comparable to other institutions.

Room rates – effective fall 2017

The room rates will increase by approximately three percent across all residence halls. The cost to maintain and manage the facilities increases each year. Contractual obligations such as cable service, Sodexo (facilities management) as well as the increase in cost of utilities continue to drive the operational cost increases. In addition to the estimated cost increases, the university reviewed rental rates with nearby apartments to ensure that the university rates did not exceed the market. Based on these results, the proposed increase to room rates is an approximate 3%.

The University is always looking to enhance the services provided to students. As a result of communication with Sodexo, a new service will be included in the room rates for those students residing in Sherman D. Scruggs. Sodexo will provide cleaning services to individual rooms including cleaning the restrooms and kitchen twice per month. To provide this service, the room rates for Sherman will increase an additional \$40 per semester.

Board rates – effective fall 2017

Board rates will be adjusted based on contractually obligated CPI increases for the Sodexo (food service) contract as well as to support the ongoing costs of management of the meal plan program. The proposed increase takes the unlimited meal plan from \$1,580 to \$1,630. This rate equates to a cost of \$14.55 per day, a very reasonable cost for an unlimited meal plan. This is an approximate 3% increase.

Other changes to the fall and spring meal plans include the following:

- A reduction in the 5 meal plan rate from \$660 per semester to \$525 per semester. The decrease reduces the approximate meal cost to \$6.56 per meal. While this price is close to a cash value cost if paying at the door, students, faculty and staff can take advantage of using their financial aid or payroll deduction to participate in this convenient and cost effective meal plan.
- The 3 meal plan will be also increase at approximately 3%.

Board rates - effective in summer 2017

The following adjustments are proposed for summer board rates.

- The unlimited meal plan was new in summer 2016 and was offered to only Jump Start students. The cost rate was \$890 per semester. To ensure that the cost does not exceed the revenue, the rate should increase to \$950 per semester. This brings the estimated cost per day to \$16.97. This will just cover the cost associated with the contractual obligation. Beginning in summer 2017, this meal plan will be offered to all summer school students.
- The 14 meal plan will remain in effect at a rate increase of \$23 or 3.07%.
- The 10 meal plan previously charged at \$670 per semester will be eliminated.
 Due to low enrollment in the plan and to increase efficiency for management of the plans, this is proposed to be eliminated.
