Tuition and Fees - effective fall 2020

Based on a February 2020 notice from Zora Mulligan. Commissioner of Higher Education and HESFA (Higher Education Student Funding Act) guidelines, Lincoln University is allowed to increase base tuition and fees by \$173.16 per year. Base tuition and fees cannot exceed \$7.482.86 for fiscal year 2021.

Base tuition is defined as tuition and fees charged to all instate undergraduate students and excludes student approved fees. Below is the calculation of base tuition and fees based on the recommendations attached.

The allowable increase of \$173.16 if approved, will be effective fall 2020.

Board rates

Fall and Spring – effective fall 2020

The board rate recommendation includes a 2.7% increase. The increase will cover the requested CPI increase from Sodexo for food service. The proposed increase takes the unlimited meal plan from \$1.777 to \$1.825 per semester.

The 5 meal plan and 3 meal plan rates will increase at the same CPI rate increase. The meal plans for both will equate to \$7.00 per meal. Non-residential students can leverage their financial aid more effectively by enrolling in a 5 or 3 meal plan.

Summer - effective summer 2021

Board rates for summer 2021 will increase approximately 2.7%. All summer school students will be assessed the 14 meal plan.

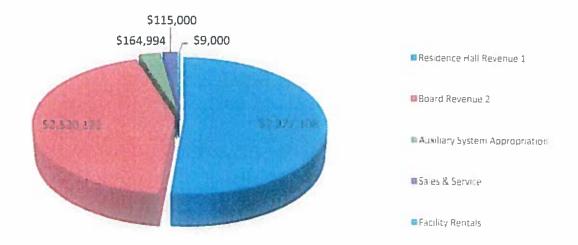
