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ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
LINCOLN UNIVERSITY AND COMPTON COMMUNITY COLLEGE COLLEGE OF GENERAL STUDIES

**OVERVIEW:** This agreement is made and entered into by and between Lincoln University, hereinafter referred to as Lincoln, and Compton Community College, hereinafter referred to as Compton. By this agreement Compton and Lincoln express a shared commitment to increasing access to and success in higher education.

**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this agreement is to clarify transfer policies and procedures and create a smooth transition for students completing general education courses at Compton Community College and transferring to Lincoln to complete baccalaureate degrees.

**CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER:**

**Section 1: ADMISSION CRITERIA AND PROCEDURES**

Compton students transferring to Lincoln must complete the same application process as other students transferring to Lincoln. Details concerning the application process can be found in the *Lincoln University Undergraduate Bulletin* or obtained from the Office of Admissions at Lincoln.

Transfer students seeking admission to Lincoln must have at least a 2.0 cumulative grade point average (G.P.A) on a scale of 4.0 for all course work attempted at Compton and must be in good standing at Compton. All completed course work submitted for evaluation must be presented on an official transcript.

**SECTION 2: TRANSFER OF CREDIT**

A maximum of 64 credit hours will be accepted by Lincoln from Compton to be applied toward any baccalaureate degree offered at Lincoln.

Only academic courses with passing letter grades (A, B, or C) will be accepted. Courses with grades of "D", "F" or "AU" are not transferable.

Student may earn college credit by examination in the College Level Examination Program (CLEP) in general education subject areas if the scores earned are at the 70<sup>th</sup> percentile or higher. Official test scores must be submitted to the Counseling and Career Services Office.

General education courses taken at Compton and listed in column one of the attached table will transfer to meet the corresponding general education requirement at Lincoln as listed in column two of the same table.

Courses taken as part of specific degree requirements at Compton will be evaluated on an individual basis for applicability toward specific major requirements in the corresponding degree at Lincoln.

Transfer credit is guaranteed only under the condition that Compton maintains accreditation by Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

Transfer students from Compton will have access to financial aid, scholarships, and student services on the same basis as native students.

### Section 3: MATRICULATION AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Lincoln will apply the same academic progress and graduation standards to Compton transfer students as those applicable to native students.


In order to graduate from Lincoln, all students must pass a minimum of 121 semester hours and maintain a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.0 at Lincoln.


In order to meet graduation requirements for an undergraduate degree at Lincoln, students must complete a minimum of 40 hours of upper division credits (courses numbered 300 or above at Lincoln). Courses taken at Compton will only transfer as lower division credits unless specified as part of a separate articulation agreement specific to an individual degree.

Compton students transferring to Lincoln may follow the graduation requirements in effect at Lincoln specified in the undergraduate bulletin during the academic year that the student is admitted to Lincoln.

#### TERMS OF AGREEMENT:

This agreement is made and entered into upon the signatures of the chief executive officers of both institutions and remains in force unless changed in writing by mutual agreement of both parties. The agreement may be amended at any time with the approval of both parties and is subject to regular review to assure currency with respective general education requirements. Should either party desire to discontinue this agreement, advance written notification of one year is required.
