PROPOSED CHANGE TO THE LIR CONSTITUTION

Vatican Splendors—A Journey through Faith and Art

August 26, 2010

Explore the splendors of Vatican art, history, culture and religion at the Missouri History Museum as we witness 2000 years of Vatican Art. Works by masters Michelangelo, Giotto, Bernini and others comprise one of the largest Vatican collections ever to tour North America. St. Louis was chosen as one of only three cities in the U.S. to host this exhibit.

Included in this day trip will be lunch at Favazza's on 'The Hill' with time to browse, shop if you like, through an Italian bakery, deli and market. To complete the day we will tour the historic St. Francis de Sales Church popularly known as the "Cathedral of South St. Louis".

Set Your Sails for the Windy City

September 8 – 12, 2010

Chicago, a city with unsurpassable beauty and something for everyone, will be our travel destination for early fall. We have attempted to allow flexibility to the schedule allowing each traveler time to explore their individual interests. The 'Go Chicago Card', which we are purchasing for events at the Museum Campus (Friday), offers many other options if you prefer to venture out on your own. Or, if you like, you may decline the purchase of this card and have a day to do exactly as you please.

Day I – "The Drive"

We will take the scenic route, traveling 54 North, connecting to I-55 in Springfield, Illinois.

Appropriate stops will be made along the way for breaks, food and walking.

Plans are to arrive at the Hyatt Regency, Chicago about 5:00 PM, which will be our 'home' for four nights..

Following check-in at the hotel, we will board the coach for a short ride to Millennium Park for a glimpse of the wonders in the park and to familiarize all with the area. The park is within walking distance of the hotel and you may want to spend free time there—so much to discover and enjoy!

Day II – "Oak Park Day"

We begin the day with a guided tour of the Frank Lloyd Wright Home and Studio, then a guided tour of Unity Temple, one of the most acclaimed buildings in the world. Following lunch at an area restaurant (included) we will tour the birth home and museum of Nobel Prize winning author, Earnest Hemmingway. This evening, those interested may want to visit the Art Institute which is also within walking distance of the hotel.

Day III – "The Unusual Plan" ("Go-Chicago' Card Day)

We will be providing a 'Chicago-Go Card' for the planned visit to the Museum Campus (Field Museum, Shedd Aquarium and the Planetarium).

However--today you have the option of planning '**your personal day in Chicago**' if you wish. (Go-Chicago Card offers many additional venues other than the Museum Campus including the Art Museum.

A group dinner (included) is planned this evening at a Greek Restaurant.

Today we will experience the city's architectural and cultural legacy with our personal step on guide. We will begin the day in one of Chicago's many ethnic neighborhoods visiting a Mexican bakery where you may enjoy a taste. We will tour many parts of the city visiting Elks National Memorial, Chicago Temple, Merchandise Mart and Lily Pool Garden. Lunch will be in Little Italy (included).
