Yes	No	Includes a reflective essay articulating student's understanding of how all the papers included in the portfolio demonstrate that the student has accomplished the objectives of the degree program. (4-5 pages.)
Yes	No	Includes one formal essay from a non-major course.
Yes	No	Includes at least 1 selection which reflects an understanding of some aspect of language usage, revision strategy, or stylistic analysis.
