
Lincoln University School of Nursing at Fort Leonard Wood offers a part-time evening nursing curriculum that leads to an Associate of Applied Science degree. Upon successful completion of the program, the student is eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensing Examination for Registered Nurses (Nursing Practice Act Section 335.066 provides additional criteria for eligibility to apply for licensure to practice nursing). Satisfactory performance on this examination will qualify the student for licensure as a registered nurse.

The nursing curriculum consists of seven sequential, nursing courses. Each course includes structured classroom and laboratory experiences. Formal classroom time includes four to six hours per week. Twelve hours per week are spent in the clinical and/or college laboratories. These experiences will be at a variety of health care settings such as hospitals, nursing homes, and clinics in the Rolla, Lebanon and Waynesville areas.

The purpose of the AAS Nursing program is to prepare graduates to apply the nursing process in the provision of nursing care in diverse settings where policies and procedures are specified and guidance is available. Emphasis in the program is placed on development of competencies essential to the practice of AAS Nursing. In addition, this program provides a basis for continued studies in nursing. Graduates are often employed in hospitals, clinics, nursing homes, physician offices and industry.

Admissions

LPNs must meet the requirements for admission to Lincoln University and the AAS program.

ADMISSION TO THE NURSING PROGRAM IS BASED UPON:

- HESI A2 with a minimum composite score of 70% in the following areas – basic math, reading comprehension, vocabulary and general knowledge, grammar and A&P within five years of application **OR** Minimum ACT composite of 19 within five years of application **AND**
- A current Missouri license in good standing
- Completion of a General Biology with a lab component.
- Completion of pre-requisite nursing courses with a GPA of 2.75 in ENG 101 Composition & Rhetoric I, PSY 101 General Psychology, BIO 208 Human Anatomy & Physiology, and BIO 209 Human Anatomy & Physiology Lab.
- Have taken MAT 111 Intermediate Algebra or transferred equivalent, or higher math course.
- Completion of a nursing school application.
- Three letters of reference on forms provided
- Official transcripts from all previous schools attended after high school/GED.
- LPNs must submit official transcripts and one reference letter from LPN school.
- Good academic & non-academic standing

Students are selected for admission to the nursing program once a year. Depending on LPN achievement on departmental exams in NUR 106, students may enroll in nursing courses based on space available and completion of pre-requisite courses. For additional information concerning admission criteria and the application process please schedule an appointment with a nursing advisor.

NUR 106 Transition to professional Nursing.....	2
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Program requirements may be met by transfer credits, which will be evaluated on an individual basis. Students may receive credit for some required non-nursing courses by CLEP testing. Must submit official CLEP transcripts.

Tuition for nursing courses is \$301.50/ credit hour and for non-nursing courses is \$232.00/credit hour. In addition to the tuition and fees charged by the

university, nursing students are assessed \$50 for each nursing course containing a laboratory/clinical component and a \$173.94 per semester technology fee.

Kaplan testing fees are also assessed each semester.

Students should anticipate spending approximately \$3,000 for nursing expenditures such as:

- Textbooks
- Uniforms
- Stethoscope
- Watch with second hand
- Graduation Fees
- Lincoln Nursing Pin
- NCLEX-RN Licensure Exam

Students are responsible for transportation to and from campus and clinical experiences.
