Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN)

The School of Nursing at Lincoln University offers a four-year nursing curriculum that leads to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN). Upon successful completion of the program, the student is eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensing Examination (NCLEX) for registered nurses. Nursing Practice Act Section 335.066 provides additional criteria for eligibility to apply for licensure to practice nursing. Satisfactory performance on this examination will qualify the student for licensure as a registered nurse.

The purpose of the BSN nursing program is to prepare individuals for professional nursing practice. The nurse prepared at the baccalaureate level is a professional who has acquired a well-delineated and broad knowledge base for practice. Emphasis within the program is placed on role development and the Essentials of Baccalaureate Education for Professional Nursing Practice (AACN, 2008). The baccalaureate graduate is prepared to provide and manage care for individuals, families, groups, communities and populations in diverse settings. The baccalaureate graduate is also a member of the profession. The BSN nursing program establishes the foundation required for continuous education within the discipline of nursing.

The nursing curriculum consists of five sequential semesters of nursing courses. Each nursing semester includes structured classroom, practicum and laboratory experiences. These experiences will occur in a variety of health care settings in the Jefferson City, Columbia, Fulton and other mid-Missouri areas.

BSN ADMISSION CRITERIA

To be considered for admissions, you must:

- Be admitted to Lincoln University
- Entrance exam within the last five years from nursing application date, meeting one of the following criteria:
 - Minimum ACT composite of 19 OR
 - HESI A2 with a minimum composite score of 70% in the following areas: basic math, reading comprehension, vocabulary and general knowledge, grammar and A&P. The HESI A2 may only be taken a max of two times per calendar year (January through December). Preparation with HESI A2 materials is highly recommended.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- TOEFL ≥ 600 if English is a second language
- A minimum of 48 credit hours that meet BSN degree requirements to enroll in Fundamentals, which must include:
 - English Composition
 - 16 hours of Life, Physical and/or Natural Science (including Anatomy and Physiology with lab, Microbiology with lab and Chemistry)
 - . Statistics
 - Psychology
 - Pre-Nursing Survey

Pre-requisite courses may be required for these courses. If you are transferring credits to Lincoln, the course requirements may vary.

- A grade of C or higher within two attempts in all required courses.
- School of Nursing application with \$25 nonrefundable application fee
- Three School of Nursing reference forms
- Personal interview by invitation
- Good academic and non-academic standing
- Copy of ALL transcripts
- Attend a School of Nursing information session

Application and references are due the last Tuesday in September for spring admission and the first Tuesday in March for fall admission.
