Suitable Blueberry Cultivars for Production in Missouri

Proper cultivar selection is a critical decision and can be the difference between success and failure with blueberry production in Missouri. Several types of blueberries are commercially produced in Missouri. Northern highbush blueberry cultivars (varieties) are well adapted for production across Missouri. The hardiest southern highbush blueberry cultivars are hardy enough for production in southern Missouri. Half-high blueberries are of low stature and adapted to container culture. Lowbush blueberries are not recommended for production in Missouri. Less hardy southern highbush and rabbiteye blueberry cultivars are not hardy enough for consistent production in most of Missouri.

Commercial blueberry farmers should consider the following criteria when selecting cultivars (Fuqua et al. 2000, Gauthier and Kaiser 2013):

• Adaptation to climate, especially, winter hardiness and the ability to withstand high temperatures during the growing season.

- Tolerance to high soil pH (measuring the amount of acid or alkaline.) Avoid cultivars that are overly sensitive to high pH soils.
- Disease resistance, especially, resistance to Phytophthora root rot.
- Cultural system.
- Harvest season; late ripening cultivars are exposed to high summer temperatures and high numbers of spotted wing drosophila.
- Productivity.
- Fruit taste, size and firmness.
- Use of the fruit; most of the Missouri blueberry crop is intended for fresh fruit sales. Cultivars adapted to this use are preferred.
- Marketing plan; most blueberries commercially grown in Missouri are intended for local, direct market sales. Cultivars adapted for this market are preferred.
