Lincoln University strongly encourages St. Louis Community College students to complete the Associate in Arts degree prior to transferring to the University. Students who transfer with an Associate in Arts degree will be admitted as Juniors in standing and St. Louis Community College courses will substitute for Lincoln University's General Education Requirements listed below. Students transferring without an Associate in Arts degree will have their transcripts evaluated on a course-by-course basis and must complete any other outstanding requirements at Lincoln University.

Foreign Language Requirement

In addition to the general education requirements listed below, all students in Bachelor of Arts degree programs are required to complete 12 hours in a foreign language.
