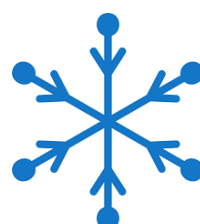
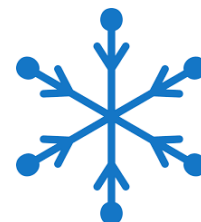
Dear Faculty and Staff of the College of Professional Studies:

New Minor in Entrepreneurship to be Offered Fall 2024

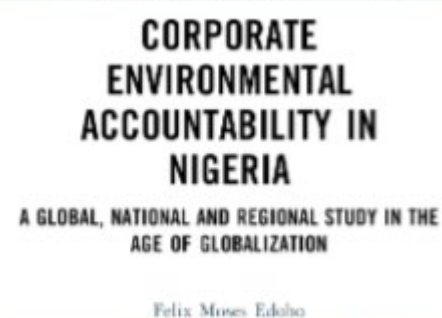

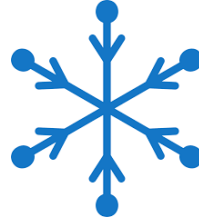

SBDC News and Events Pitch-it-to-Win-It Competition Business Summit

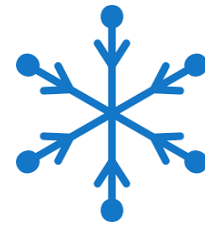

In October, the Missouri SBDC at Lincoln University in partnership with the JC Chamber of Commerce hosted its 12th annual Start Up JC Pitch It & Win It Competition. This competition is for new business start-ups and existing businesses with less than \$150,000 in annual gross revenue in the JC area to compete for seed money with a total of \$10,000 for the winner(s). This year we had over 25 small business applicants, of which 8 went on to compete in the final pitch competition. The prize money is funded by the MO SBDC at LU through a grant issued by the Ewing Kaufman Foundation. This year's 1st place & winner of \$5,000 in seed money went to Tawanda's Cafeteria LLC. There was a tie for 2nd place with Mobile Gaming Entertainment LLC and Creative Escapes LLC both taking home a check for \$2,500 each in seed money. The winners were announced November 2nd, at the 2023 JC area Chamber of Commerce Business Summit.

The Missouri SBDC at LU in partnership with the JC Chamber of Commerce held the annual Business Summit. The Missouri SBDC at LU was the Main sponsor of this as well. This event is all about business! It provides an opportunity to network with business professionals, market products and serves from businesses, recognize outstanding businesses and employees with the presentation of the Small Business and Employee Awards and the Pitch It & Win It competition.

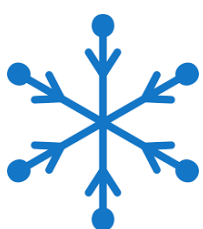

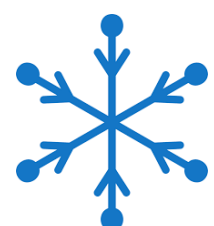
